Harvey Fierstein (Book): Harvey Fierstein is the author of the Tony-winning hit, *Kinky Boots*, as well as *Torch Song Trilogy* (Tony, Drama Desk and Obie Awards), *La Cage aux Folles* (Tony and Drama Desk Awards), *Newsies* (Tony nominated), *Casa Valentina* (Tony nominated), *A Catered Affair* (12 Drama Desk nominations), *Safe Sex* (Ace Award), *Legs Diamond, Spookhouse, Flatbush Tosca, Common Ground* and more. He has recently rewritten *The Wiz* for live TV broadcast, and penned a revised book for *Funny Girl*, currently running in London. His political editorials have been published in the *New York Times, TV Guide* and the *Huffington Post* and broadcast on PBS's *In the Life*. His children's book, *The Sissy Duckling* (Humanitas Award), is now in its fifth printing. As an actor, Mr. Fierstein is known worldwide for his performances in films including *Mrs. Doubtfire, Independence Day,* and *Bullets Over Broadway,* on stage in *Hairspray* (Tony Award), *Fiddler on the Roof, La Cage aux Folles, Torch Song Trilogy* (Tony Award), and on TV shows such as *Smash, How I Met Your Mother, The Good Wife, Cheers* (Emmy nomination), *The Simpsons, Family Guy,* and *Nurse Jackie.*

Jerry Herman (Music and Lyrics): *Hello, Dolly!, Mame*, and *La Cage aux Folles* are home to some of the most popular, most-often performed and most successful musical hero(in)es of all time, and have given Jerry Herman the distinction of being the only composer-lyricist in history to have had three musicals that ran more than 1,500 consecutive performances on Broadway. His first Broadway show was *Milk and Honey* (1961), followed by *Hello, Dolly!* (1964), *Mame* (1966), *Dear World* (1969), *Mack & Mabel* (1974), *The Grand Tour* (1979), *La Cage aux Folles* (1983), *Jerry's Girls* (1985) and *Mrs. Santa Claus* (1996), a CBS TV special starring Angela Lansbury. *Showtune*, a revue of his life's work, is performing in regional theatres around the country and two of Jerry's classic songs are the emotional highlights of the hit Disney-Pixar film *WALL-E*. His string of awards and honors includes multiple Tony Awards, Grammys, Olivier Awards, Drama Desk Awards, the Johnny Mercer Award, the Richard Rodgers Award, the Oscar Hammerstein Award, the Frederick Loewe Award, the Songwriters Hall of Fame, the Theatre Hall of Fame and most recently The Kennedy Center Honors.

Sam Pinkleton (Director): Sam Pinkleton most recently directed Cole Escola's *Oh, Mary!*, currently running on Broadway at the Lyceum Theater. Previously at Pasadena Playhouse he co-created and directed *Pasadena Playhouse Holiday Spectacular* and co-directed *Head Over Heels* (with Jenny Koons). Other highlights: *You Will Get Sick* (Roundabout), *The Wizard of Oz* (ACT – San Francisco), *Untitled DanceShowPartyThing* (Virgin Voyages – with Ani Taj), and Liz

Cheyenne Jackson (Georges) Grammy[®]-nominated Cheyenne Jackson is a multi-talented stage, television and film actor, singer, and songwriter. Cheyenne was most recently seen in *Call Me Kat*, the *Saved by the Bell* revival, *American Horror Story: Apocalypse*, and Disney's *Descendants 3*. Cheyenne starred in the HBO biopic of Liberace, *Behind the Candelabra*, and appeared in *American Woman*, *Full Circle*, *Glee*, and *30 Rock*. He originated the role of Matthew in the off-Broadway musical *Altar Boyz* and starred in *All Shook Up*. Additional Broadway credits include *Xanadu*, *Damn Yankees*, *Finian's Rainbow*, *The Performers*, and *Into the Woods*. Cheyenne has also appeared in numerous films, including *The Green*, *Love is Strange*, *Price Check*, *A Beautiful Now*, and the Oscar[®]-nominated *United 93*.

Growing edges and digging deep are their fuel along with shared experiences, community making, alternative mutual aid solutions and constantly trying to fuck up the systems that need fucking. He was most recently seen in Taylor Mac and Matt Ray's *Bark of Millions* (World and US premiers), and James Harrison Monaco's *Travels* (Ars Nova). Shea Diamond (she/her) (Jacqueline): Shagasyia Diamond, known as Shea Diamond, is an accomplished American singer, songwriter, and actress born on March 17, 1978, in Little Rock, Arkansas. With a powerful narrative shaped by her experiences, Shea blends soul, R&B, and pop in her music. She gained recognition for hits like "I Am America" and has been nominated for a GLAAD Award. Shea's acting credits include a supporting role in the film *F.L.Y.* and appearances in the series *Pose*. A passionate advocate for LGBTQ+ rights and mental health awareness, Shea actively mentors aspiring artists from underrepresented communities, using her platform to promote diversity and inclusivity in the arts.

Ryan J. Haddad (he/him) (Jean-Michel): Ryan J. Haddad is an actor and playwright. His autobiographical plays include *Dark Disabled Stories* (Bushwick Starr/Public Theater, Obie for

Best New American Play); *Hi, Are You Single?* (Woolly Mammoth/IAMA, Helen Hayes nomination); and the upcoming *Hold Me in the Water* (Playwrights Horizons, Spring 2025). A friend took him to see a sketch comedy/improv show at LA's famous Groundling Theater, and everything changed for him. McDonald quit his banking job, enrolled in the Groundlings Improv Program, and became a member of the troupe from 1992 to 1997. His first professional writing and acting jobs came from Concorde Pictures, Roger Corman's infamous low-budget movie studio.
